

Pastor Ponderings

Friends,

The calendar above my desk is reminding me that "the most wonderful time of the year" is soon before us. There are a lot of tasks and chores to do before we get there, some more pleasant than others. We will choose the next president of the United States, and other elected officials, as we are currently subject to the barrage of absolute horrible things being said about each one. I have read on more than one media outlet that the number one location in the country for police calls reporting a variety of crimes are Walmart stores, because folks are not able to behave themselves. I read on the front page of the Post Gazette this past Sunday, of the dilemma the Catholic Church is facing in Pittsburgh and across the country: all these beautiful church buildings that were once full but are now mostly empty, and what do they do with all this real estate? I think of the old WWJD slogan that was supposed to help Christians almost a generation ago stop and consider "What Would Jesus Do?" when faced with a choice or life dilemma. But in a self-centered society, so many have justified their own actions of "It's my way or the highway", to be the words and actions of Jesus and maybe that has helped erode our world from what it could really look like with God in control. I keep hearing the words audibly or see the actions displayed on social media: "But I'm entitled to my own opinion!" Although that may be true, there is an accountability factor we are desperately lacking in our day to day walk. There are consequences for voicing one's own opinion that we don't want to accept, so the circle continues as we point our finger at our neighbor's faults, or we envy what they have, and we longer need a place to refocus or seek guidance, direction or forgiveness because after all "I'm entitled to my own opinion!"

It seems to me the slippery slope has gotten slipperier and our social-, moral- and Jesus- compass needs recalibrated to true Truth. Society as a whole has either forgotten or felt betrayed, bewildered, or confused by the institution called church because their own individual needs are not being met, by their own personal Savior who came into the world just for them. We listen to a variety of music while in the car depending on who's driving and who's in the car. I like country, maybe WSSH or 3WS but mostly when Laura and the girls are in the car we listen to K-Love Christian music. But recently our girls also like to listen to the pop stations, (teen music for a better term) and there are a few stations they switch back and forth to when going to music, horse or dance lessons. They seem to know the tunes, and some of the words, so as a good dad this week while riding alone, I tuned to their stations to listen for words. What are these songs saying?

Some good. Some not so good. Some really not good! The overall theme for the majority of the songs I heard was "I'm entitled to my own opinion, I can do what I want!" It was stated using differing words, tunes, rhythms - some quite catchy, but I found myself saying more than once "Did that singer just say what I thought he did?" and that was not a good thing. Laura and I value the thoughts, feelings and opinions of our girls and as their parents we are held accountable for their social, moral and faith foundations that are either built or dismissed at the family level in their formative years. As a pastor, I am called to shepherd God's people, to help guide, counsel and care for the spiritual and temporal affairs of the church and its members. As citizens of the United States of America, we have the right to cast our vote and also the responsibility to perhaps use WWJD as a way to make decisions in our country that still affirm "In God We Trust." There is accountability for good and bad behavior, opinions that are expressed, and lives that are lived that are reflected in the events that mark the holiday season from Thanksgiving to Christmas, "the most wonderful time of the year!"


